# Housekeeping

Mindful of our plans to add Southern Counties Minutes to our website, this has been a topic of discussion at Committee and we resolved to charge Nick Varlow, our National Executive Committee (NEC) Director, to discuss at NEC level whether there is appetite for them to publish NEC Minutes in the Member's Area of the NEC website. In short, Nick argued "we are a Member's Club and have a right to know what we (NEC) do with our subscriptions". After some discussion, it was resolved that the NEC discusses commercial issues where it would be inappropriate to air them, and also there is "no groundswell of member demand to see the minutes". However, it was resolved that approved NEC Minutes are available on request to the Hon. Secretary, with the caveat that personal information might still be redacted. If you have any issue with this position, I am happy to hear your views.

At NEC, Nick continues to work on the consolidation of the Club's Technical Databases and is now also in discussion about the concept of 'Tech Experts available "on tap"'. More to follow. Pre-population of the Member's Map remains 'work in progress'. Nick tells us there is currently a limit on the IT resource available at NEC level, resulting in slower progress than he would like. He is working on it, but is having to prioritise the order in which he works on projects.

Nick also tells us to expect a new NEC Chairman to be appointed at the AGM and the search is on to find a new National Membership Secretary. If you are interested in this latter position (which pays an honorarium), please respond without delay to me, or Nick.

We would also like to remind you that booking for IHM2026 is open. It is hosted by Thames Valley and you can anticipate a boat trip on the Thames and visits to Winsdsor Castle and Brookland Museum. The Syd Seigal Memorial Trophy Healey Race will run again on 5<sup>th</sup> July 2026, moving to Donnington. This year's race was the subject of the cover article in the July issue of Revcounter.

Booking remains open for the European Healey Meeting 14-20 June 2027 in Holland. It sounds as though over 25% of the 190 or so registrations are from the UK.

Goodwood Revival 12-14 September: Whilst not a Southern Counties event, I know a number of our members attend, and there were Healeys racing! Special mention must go to Jack Rawles and Jake Hill, who raced DHD100 (a 100S, chassis AHS 3603) from 15<sup>th</sup> on the grid to finish 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Freddie March Memorial Trophy on the Friday evening. Both drivers played their part with storming opening laps from Jack, and Jake keeping his calm when conditions became stormy later in the race (Healeys do well in the rain). See below the car in the Assembly Area shortly before the race. Saturday's racing also featured Healeys, including Jack Rawles partnering with Jaap Sinke, this time in 54FAC (the original works Sebring entry) in the Stirling Moss Memorial Trophy – it was an attritional race. I should also mention, two of Donald Healey's trophies were auctioned at the Bonhams auction, including The Rallye International de Monte-Carlo 'Challenge de L'illustration Autombile' trophy, permanently awarded to Donald Healey in 1934 after being 1<sup>st</sup> 1931, 2<sup>nd</sup> 1932, 3<sup>rd</sup> (1<sup>st</sup> in class) 1934. Generally, it was a wet and windy weekend but people still had fun. The central themes were the 1960's, hippies and Jim Clark. #### **Rear View Mirror**

October 1995: The AGM was looming. The list of Committee positions included Competition Secretary (a busy role back then), Regalia Secretary and Ten Tenths Editor. Ten Tenths stated the Committee tries to keep to four 2–3-hour meetings each year with meetings in the Gatwick area (these days it's hopefully nearer to 2 hours but every 2 months). Some familiar words were written "Remember, if there are changes you would like to see, or events you would like to be organised, we need you to get out to the AGM and help us organise things as you want them". A lunch was planned at the Victory Inn, Staplefield to watch the London to Brighton Veteran Run and a Christmas Party was in the planning.

October 2005: In addition to the events mentioned for October 1995, there was mention of a Planned Drive and Pub Lunch to be organised by Derek Edwards, departing from the Reigate Hill car park (Autumn Leaves) – attendance was encouraged "even if it is wet, or your Healey is off the road" (no excuses!).

October 2015: There was an article about the International Healey Weekend in the Cotswolds. Southern Counties was charged with putting on a gymkhana i.e. a fun test for cars and their crews: Test 1: 'know your distance' (parking), Test 2: 'welly wanging' (hurling wellington boots at a target), Test 3 'The Cotswold Tour' (driving skills test). Dave Colwell was the force behind the gymkhana and said afterwards "The thing is, it was a demonstration of real team working for which I feel proud. We have demonstrated our ability to contribute successfully to an International Event. A real big thank you to everyone". There were also articles about the Classic and Prestige Car Day at the Lamb Inn, Piltdown, and the Bluebell Railway Vintage Transport Weekend, with Southern Counties showing nine cars on the Saturday.

Summer is rapidly turning into autumn but the year is not quite over yet and I hope you will manage a few more Healey miles before winter arrives. I certain hope to. I also hope to squeeze in one more issue of Ten Tenths before Christmas (after the National AGM and our final Southern Committee Meeting of the year). That and the February issue might be a little slimmer as we do less miles.
